



Goals & Objectives – Starting New Ministries

- 1) **Course:** MTC013 Starting New Ministries
- 2) **Length:** 4 weeks / 8 hours
- 3) **Course Description:** This course is designed to begin to equip leaders with models, principles, strategies, and methodologies for starting new ministries: planting new churches, starting faith communities, imagining ways to connect with the people in a community, etc. Each start will have an apostolic ethos of continual reproduction. It surveys Biblical materials on starting new ministries, examines recent literature and resources, and evaluates successful ministry starts.
- 4) **Instructional Goals and Objectives:**
 - a) **Being Objectives (Spiritual Formation):** The student will
 - i) have a renewed love for the Church;
 - ii) have a deep conviction concerning the Biblical priority of starting new ministries;
 - iii) have a broken heart for the lost, especially for those who have no place to gather;
 - iv) lead others by being a servant and a Chief-Repenter;
 - v) realize the priority of prayer and how to build a prayer team;
 - vi) understand the priority of having a clear call.
 - b) **Knowing Objectives (Cognitive Formation):** The student will
 - i) understand why ecclesia exists;
 - ii) identify any start's priorities in ministry;
 - iii) know how to determine the core motivations for ministry;
 - iv) understand how ministries work together;
 - v) know how to raise and manage ministry finances;
 - vi) understand how to build a launch team;
 - vii) know how to lead and manage any new start;
 - viii) understand how to personally survive and thrive in ministry.
 - c) **Doing Objectives (Conative Formation):** The student will
 - i) begin to make decisions and plans to move into a new start mindset and activity;
 - ii) develop an intentional discipleship strategy which focuses on training local people to live and think with a new start mindset.
